

CELEBRATING DIFFERENT FAMILIES (KS2)

This workshop helps young people explore different types of families and learn the definitions of terms such as 'gay', 'lesbian' and 'homophobia', exploring the use of the word 'gay' in particular, and when and why its use is acceptable or unacceptable.

Young people explore how to best respond if they witness or experience homophobia and look at what they can do in their school to ensure that their classroom is inclusive for everyone.

SAMPLE ACTIVITY



KS2: What Makes a Family?

Young people are given picture cards and asked to sort them into pictures that show a family and those that don't. They are asked the reasons behind their choices, before it is revealed that they all show a family. Young people discuss what makes a family and explore the many different forms a family can take.

Outcome: Young people realise the assumptions that can be made about different families, that there are all kinds of families which are equally valid and the positives that different families bring.

What young people have learnt in Celebrating Different Families workshops:

"Don't let other people's idea of you affect who you are"

"Gay is not a bad thing – you shouldn't use the word in a negative way to other people"
