

FAITH IN US (KS2 - 5)

This workshop develops young people's understanding of identity, Islam and Islamophobia exploring these themes through myth busting, reflection, discussion and interactive activities.

The workshop explores what Islamophobia is and the harm that it causes, and young people discuss practical steps they can take if they witness or experience Islamophobia. Myths about Islam & Muslims are explored and debunked, empowering young people to challenge and reject misinformation and harmful stereotypes.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES



KS2: Guess Who?

Young people work in groups to match a selection of people to their careers, guessing whether each person is or is not a Muslim. The correct answers are revealed with discussion.

Outcome: Young people recognise the negative impact of stereotypes, and learn about the diversity within Islam.

Seeds: the influences and conditions in society that foster or encourage prejudice and hatred

Weeds: the events that are able to flourish because of the seeds that have been planted

KS3-5: Seeds and Weeds

Young people are provided with a set of cards describing different events or situations, and are asked to decide whether each card is a 'seed', something which provides the circumstances for Islamophobia to flourish, or a 'weed', an example of Islamophobia.

Outcome: Young people recognise the environments and circumstances within which Islamophobia can grow and flourish and are empowered to consider ways in which they can prevent Islamophobia.
