

HOME FROM HOME (KS2 - 5)

This workshop explores themes of immigration and seeking refuge and aims to build young people's awareness and empathy.

The workshop clarifies definitions of immigrant, asylum seeker and refugee, exploring why people move and the various processes they may go through. Myths about immigration are discussed and debunked and young people consider how believing in false information can be harmful.

Young people consider ways that they can be active citizens, welcoming new members of their school communities and challenging misinformation and stereotypes.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES



Liliane's

KS2: Liliane's Story

Young people work in groups to place story cards into the correct order. The class read through the story together, discussing the themes and events.

Outcome: Young people are more empathetic to a refugee's journey, and have considered positive actions they could take to ensure their peers are welcome and safe at school.

KS3-5: Understanding Migration

Young people work in groups to match descriptions to key terms, exploring what it means to be an immigrant, refugee, asylum seeker and illegal immigrant.

Outcome: Young people understand the differences between these key terms, and have greater awareness of the various processes. Young people are able to use this knowledge to begin debunking myths, for example, the stereotype that all immigrants are illegal.
