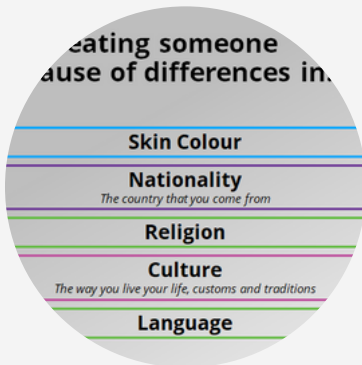


# REJECT RACISM (KS2 - 5)

In this workshop young people explore what racism is, how it manifests, appropriate terminology, and taking an active role in challenging racism and preventing bullying.

Using interactive group activities young people explore what is meant by the term racism, understanding which traits are targeted and what this might look like. Young people are given the appropriate terminology to discuss race and identity, and are empowered to consider the ways in which they can prevent and challenge racism in their everyday lives.

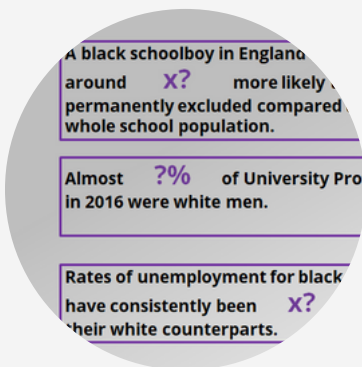
## SAMPLE ACTIVITIES



### KS2: What is Racism?

Young people are given a sentence starter 'Racism is treating someone unfairly because of differences in...' and pack of cards listing different traits. Young people select which of the traits would correctly complete the sentence.

**Outcome:** Young people learn the definition of racism, and that although all forms of bullying and discrimination are wrong, not all are racism.



### KS3-5: Impact of Racism

Young people follow the lives of two children, one Black, one White, exploring statistics and how these might impact on the children's opportunities and the barriers that they might face as they grow up. Groups then choose to focus on one of these barriers and plan a campaign that they could undertake to create positive change.

**Outcome:** Young people understand the structural barriers that can impact a person's opportunities to succeed, and are empowered to consider ways they could make positive change.
