

Think! (KS2)

Think! is a two-hour critical thinking workshop. The workshop explores stereotypes and their impact, and the reliability of various information sources.

Young people learn the importance of fact checking, and the skills with which to question the reliability of information. Young people also recognise stereotypes and understand the potential harm these can cause. They are empowered and encouraged to challenge misinformation and stereotypes.

SAMPLE ACTIVITY



KS2: Dinner Party

Young people work in groups to choose from a selection of cards who they would invite to their imaginary dinner party, and who they would not invite. They give reasons for their choices. The real identity of all the potential guests is revealed and young people's assumptions are challenged.

Outcome: Young people reflect on the assumptions and judgements that are often made about people, learn the term stereotype and understand the potential harm that stereotyping can cause.
